Dear Applicant,

Thank you for considering becoming a volunteer with the Tuolumne County Sheriff's office. By doing so you may choose to apply to be a member of either the **Community Service Unit (CSU)** or the **Search & Rescue (SAR) Team**.

Before submitting this application, please take the time to weigh out the costs and rewards. To be a team member you are committing to give your time, approximately 16 hrs. per month, and to purchase various uniform items.

The following pages explain some of the expectations to be a volunteer in good standing as well as the benefits of being a volunteer. If you feel as though you have the ability to contribute to the continued success of the Sheriff's Office then, please complete the application and submit it to the Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office.

Once submitted, the application will receive a preliminary screening. Following a favorable review, an invitation may be extended to have an interview on the next hiring cycle which will be less than 90 days.

Interviews will be conducted by a panel comprised of volunteer leaders and Sheriff's personnel.

If the panel decides to offer you a position, a final comprehensive background check will be performed before you are sworn in as a Trainee.

Once hired, you will be issued an ID Card, and assigned a trainer who will orient you to the team procedures. Each area in which you offer to volunteer has a "Skills Sign Off Sheet" that must be completed before you will be deemed qualified.

The path to becoming a valuable team member will require patience, perseverance and hard work. Many dedicated members have found volunteering immensely rewarding. Thank you for your interest in joining our Team and we look forward to reviewing your application.

Requirements

Before filling out this application, we ask that you consider the commitment required to be a volunteer. Along with the rewards there are also some sacrifices. Volunteers must be aware of commitments to the team and the community. It also takes time to train new volunteers,

Time Obligations

CSU volunteers are asked to commit approximately 16 hrs per month to an area they are interested in.

SAR volunteers must be available at any time, day or night, including weekends, holidays, birthdays and weekdays. We understand that families and jobs are a priority. However, this part-time, on call, non-paying adventure should be your next priority. The Sheriff's Office handles a SAR Incident approximately 45 times a year. We ask that all members be available to respond to at least 50% of all SAR Incidents.

We also have a monthly meeting and monthly training evening. These are augmented by the annual training schedule to maintain necessary skills. This often requires a weekend per month training in the spring. On average, it takes up to 12 months to qualify a new member.

Competency Requirements

Volunteers must be safe and effective. After joining the Team, you will be assigned a training officer and be provided with a "Skills Sign-Off Sheet" containing a list of basic skills needed for a chosen task.

In order to become qualified, the average volunteer should endeavor to participate in 16-20 hours of training per month, until they are fully qualified.

For SAR volunteers, most training is done in-house, by qualified instructors on the Team, at no (or minimal) charge, typically on weekends and in the evenings.

Monetary Considerations

The Sheriff's Office provides team gear, member safety gear and much of the member's personal equipment. However, members must provide their own apparel and often choose to buy their own personal equipment. Occasionally, the member may choose to attend an outside class at their own expense. Be aware that volunteer members, in general, receive no compensation of their time.

Search & Rescue (SAR)

About the Team

Since 1975, the Tuolumne County Sheriff's Search and Rescue Team (SAR) has been responding to search and rescue calls of all kinds, in all seasons, and at all hours. It is one of the oldest teams in continuous service in the state of California.

Tuolumne County is a recreational destination due to its numerous attractions and all season mountain and water recreational sports. SAR maintains a steady mission-call volume throughout the year averaging 50 calls per year. Many lives have been saved by the team which is composed of over 30 volunteers who often put themselves at risk to assist others in need.

Tuolumne County SAR disciplines include:

- Ground searcher with GPS, Map and Compass
- Medical
- K-9s
- Equestrian, Snowmobiles and ATV
- Air Operations (Stanislaus County and other mutual aid)
- Swift water and ice rescue
- Technical rope rescue, specializing in both high and low angle operations
- Incident Support team with GIS mapping and resource management
- Dive recovery with Sheriff's boat patrol dive team

Volunteers

Search and Rescue volunteers are typically Tuolumne County residents age 18 and older. Experience is preferable. However, we do train new volunteers. Team members must have a desire to help others. Applicants must be physically fit and ready to work in extreme environments with a team approach. Volunteers donate their time and efforts.

Tuolumne County SAR members volunteer over 7000 training and mission hours per year to serve their community, and those who visit, as well as providing mutual aid to surrounding counties.

Community Service Unit

Mission Statement

It is the mission of the CSU to work with the Sheriff's Office to help make Tuolumne County a safer and more enjoyable place to live, work, and visit.

Background

Tuolumne County encompasses 2,293 square miles of territory. The ability of the Sheriff's Office to provide law enforcement services over such a wide area is severely limited. The county continues to grow in population and law enforcement needs. The ability of the Sheriff's Office to meet the rising need for service has become more difficult with the current budget limitations.

The increased need for services by the Sheriff's Office requires increased personnel and added expenditure of public funds, which are not always available. A partial answer to this problem is the utilization of the volunteer pool of talent and experience in the community.

CSU Activities

Community Assistance Patrol

The Community Assistance Patrol (CAP) performs a multitude of duties which include serving subpoenas, vacation checks, handicap parking enforcement, motorist assists, victim witness transport, crime scene security, property bookings, etc. CAP Unit members receive special training to perform these specific duties. All CAP Volunteers are subject to being called out at any time.

CAP volunteers must maintain excellent rapport with other law enforcement agencies.

Marine Enforcement (Boat Patrol)

Boat Patrol volunteers assist the uniformed deputies in patrolling the four main lakes in Tuolumne County. At the beginning of the boat patrol season, volunteers refresh their first aid and CPR skills. They also have the opportunity to learn boat handling and trailering skills. Boat Patrol volunteers may assist uniformed deputies in the following activities:

- Accident Investigations
- Boat Patrol
- Boating Safety Presentations
- Body Recovery Operations

- Searches
- Vessel Assistance
- Vessel Inspections

Vehicle Maintenance Unit

The Maintenance Unit is comprised of three to five volunteers. Basic duties consist of preventative maintenance on Sheriff's Office vehicles. The unit meets weekly to clean vehicles, check fluid levels, ferry vehicles to other areas for repairs, check for service due, etc.

CSU members are asked to donate 16 hrs. per month to some activity. As a team member it is important to work well with others and commit to 25% of team events.


